Secretary's Report 2013-14

The Holidays In the financial year 2013-14 we again provided **14 weeks of holidays** at the Nightingale Centre, Great Hucklow for children from the areas around Wigan, Mansfield, Nottingham, Birmingham, Hull, Towcester, Manchester, Southend-on-Sea, a new group from Chester, and 5 groups from Liverpool. A similar number of weeks is anticipated for 2015, including at least one, possibly three, new groups, increasing our geographical spread. Our secondary 50th Anniversary aim of broadening our reach has been achieved; a further 2 new groups are possibly in line for 2016.

Responses from the groups, leaders and children, again plenty of the latter, testify to the value of the breaks we provide. Leaders are positive in their remarks, often citing the helpfulness of the Nightingale Centre staff members, and the service received from Andrew's Coaches. Visitors to the Centre alongside SACH groups are usually most impressed, and we have enjoyed several donations from a variety of groups of people inspired by the children. Once again we find some of our client SACH groups are under increasing funding pressure, making our holidays an even more valuable resource.

Fund-raising Once again, we have been delighted to meet our target for the year, though we have benefited from several substantial one-off donations. We need to maintain our fund-raising momentum to ensure we can maintain and expand our provision of holidays. All of our Jubilee (50th) **publicity items** are still available on request to me; Derek Smith's Service can still be used. Invitations are still welcome for my "SACH History Slideshow" Service! Our thanks are again due to our Donations Treasurer-cum-"**fund-chaser**", **Sue Cooper** in approaching various Fund-giving bodies both Unitarian and non-Unitarian. We really do need a Fund Raiser to take this work forward and contact trusts and companies which might be sympathetic to us and the particular service we provide. Once again I am amazed at the variety of ways in which folk have fund-raised for us, and the generosity. Groups of **Visitors to the Centre** itself, **Unitarian and** non-Unitarian, as mentioned above, again feature in our list of donors: thank you all.

Treasurer's Report for the year ended 30th September 2014

Donations this year amounted to £58,700. Thank you to everyone who has helped us to raise so much. The numbers were actually flattered by a second contribution of £10,000 to match what we raised in our 50^{th} anniversary year and a one-off donation of £10,000 from an anonymous charitable trust.

We were again able to provide holidays for fourteen groups of children. The total cost was £82,400.

On an income and expenditure basis, we spent £12,900 more than our income! This is a serious deficit and we must try to raise more money this year to maintain the number of holidays. Using the Charity Commissioners' preferred method, whereby we take into account the £9,600 increase in the value of our investments, our deficit was £3,300.

In addition to the two large donations mentioned above, we have received numerous donations from congregations, individuals, charitable trusts, district associations and from special events. We appreciate donations of all sizes. I would like to mention in particular Mansfield Manor Mark Lodge Freemasons, the Elliott Masonic Lodge, Mansfield, Broxtowe Lodge Freemasons, the Dagney Raymond Trust, the Joseph & Ann Slater Memorial Fund, the Leonard Chamberlain Trust, South Birmingham Friends Institute Trust and Gorse Bank Charitable Trust. The Freemasons in and around Mansfield make a generous contribution towards the holiday for children from the town and I am sure that if we had contacts with Freemasons in other towns and cities whose children come on holidays provided by the Fund, they would also be happy to contribute. If you have any contacts, please let Derek Smith or me know.

I would also like to thank those of you who make donations by standing order. It is good to be able to rely on regular donations. Almost all of our regular donors have moved their standing orders from Lloyds to our CAF Bank account, but the archaic Lloyds system means that there are still a couple of people who I cannot trace and who are still sending standing orders to the old Lloyds account. Please contact me if you are one of them. Please also contact me if you would like to set up a standing order.

Other income during the year came from dividends and interest, which held up well; from reclaiming income tax (thank you for gift aiding personal donations); and from Easyfundraising. As we approach Christmas, if you are shopping online, please do it via Easyfundraising as the Fund receives a small donation from everything you spend without it costing you anything. I would like to thank Sue Cooper for her efforts as Donations Treasurer. Sue receives and pays in hundreds of donations throughout the year. I would also like to thank Mike Georgiou for checking the accounts once again.

It is customary for me to finish my report by proposing a target for next year. $\pounds 50,000$ was a huge target for this year, but we beat it. There were some large one-off donations that helped and that are unlikely to be repeated. I hope that we have some momentum, so I think we should aim to raise $\pounds 50,000$ in 2014-15 as well.
